
How does a referendum work?

Student Issue

• The issue may be one not already addressed in the long range plan or ongoing advocacy efforts



Petition Initiated

- Student initiates petition
- Petition is submitted to Chief Returning Officer (CRO)







Petition vetting & submission to Board

• CRO completes vetting and approval process and sends petition to Board

Petition turns into Referendum

• If the Board approves the petition, it officially becomes a referendum



Official Question Formulation

- The Board and Elections Referenda Committee (ERC) **propose a question** that captures the spirit of the petition
- Once the Board approves the question, it is officially announced

'Yes'/'No' Committee Formation & Campaigning


• 2 student led committees are formed – a 'Yes Committee' (for the question) and a 'No Committee' (against the question)






Voting & Campaigning Begins

 'Yes'/'No' Committees campaign for their position and WUSA members vote for or against the question







Completion of Voting Period

 Voting results are tallied and submitted to the Board to determine next steps
